Campus News

The class of 2015 didn't have to squeeze on the risers in their commencement at Harvest: they were only a class of 63. But the contribution of this, the thirty-eighth graduating class, to the company of Woodcrest Christian alumni brought the total to over 2200. As they move on to college, they will have over \$260,000 in scholarship aid to assist them, a sizeable amount for such a small class. Jaclyn Perry and Mitchell Peters represented their class as speakers, and also getting a spot at the podium was **Mr. Scott Reynolds** ('92), the Finance Director for the school system who has accompanied many groups of student missionaries to Central America.

Faculty Changes

With the departure of **Mr. Cameron Stevens** from the Vice Principal's office, **Mr. Mark Poncy** was hired to take his place. He guided the discipleship and chapel programs until an offer from Linfield Christian—where he had taught earlier in his career—lured him back. So, WCS alum **Alfredo Ramos** ('04) was elevated to this administrative post. Mr. Ramos will continue to teach the Honors Bible 4 class, but will take an increasing role in the high school missions program. In preparation for that, he and other administrators travelled to Central America to lay the ground work for next spring's trips. To replace Mr. Ramos in the classroom, we have hired **Mr. Gabriel Estrada**, a graduate of Beeson Seminary in

Alabama. Also hired was **Mr. Randy Whaley**. He will be teaching history and will take over the computer classes from Mr. Gauss who needs to give more time to the increasing IT demands at both campuses. Then, **Mrs. Georgette Eideh** felt it was time to stay at home with her boys, and taking over the biology classes will be **Mr. Daniel Kari**, a graduate of King High School and Cal Baptist in town. In a last minute departure, **Mrs. Eva Helt** departed for a position at Maranatha Christian High School. Praise the Lord: he supplied **Rhonda Tilton** to fill this vacancy.

Mrs. Julie Sullivan left the chem lab and started the year as Director of Staff Development where she led the faculty through sessions dealing with variety in presentation, student learning styles, and curriculum development (the latter based on a book called *Understanding by Design*). When the newly hired chemistry teacher Leslie Burgos was unable to continue, however, it was back to the classroom for Mrs. Sullivan. Of interest to WCS alumni, **Alicia Rollins** ('07) has been hired to teach the Life Science course in seventh grade, replacing **Mrs. Brittany Herndon**, who left when her husband accepted a pastorate in Colorado.

Most of you have probably already heard, but the extended Woodcrest Christian family suffered a loss with the unexpected death of **Coach Prater's** wife, Debbie.

This occurred on a night that their daughter McKenna was competing in a basketball play-off game, and came as surprise not only to the family but the whole school community. Please continue to hold the Prater family up in prayer as they seek to carry on after this loss.

2014-15 Sports

“Surprising” was the term WCHS Athletic Director Mr. Ricards used to describe results of the 2014-5 sports program at WCHS. With a small senior class, the contribution of experienced players was correspondingly reduced. Then several long-time coaches stepped down and new leadership had to be found. Nevertheless, the teams continued to excel and in Mr. Ricards opinion it proved to be a much improved year for sportsmanship and representing Christ.

Fall Sports

In the fall, both cross country teams added to the Woodcrest Christian harrier tradition by winning league and making it to the CIF-SS finals. The girls went on to run in the state meet where they took seventh place. They were led by Marissa Thompson (10), but she was supported by a strong cast of young runners, and they should be strong next year, too. Michael Conant (Jr.) was the only qualifier for the boys, and he ran well in Clovis. The big news came after the conclusion of the season when Coach Billy York, who had led the team for more than two decades, decided it was time for him to retire. A huge dinner was given in his honor, and assistant coaches Steve Voges, Ben Nunnally, and James Flores jointly shared the emcee tasks for a program of tribute and roast. Also at the dinner, WCS alum **Eric Reynolds** ('90) was introduced as Coach Billy's

successor.

Woodcrest's girls' tennis team preformed marvelously and captured second place behind new Ambassador league member Notre Dame, their highest finish in a long time. Standouts for the squad were the doubles team of Cheyenne Thornton (Sr.) and Jill O'Neill (Jr.) and the strongest singles player was Lauren Blount (Jr.). Following the season, head coach Brian Huerter retired, and Evan Parry, his assistant will take over the team, and he will be assisted by **Marissa Gauss** ('10).

All we can say about the girls' volleyball team is “Wow!” Behind the big hitting of League MVP Lauren Wells (Sr.) and All-Leaguer Tesa Oaks (So.), they captured the Ambassador League title and stormed into the playoffs. In post-season play, they became the first Woodcrest team to make it to the CIF finals. At the libero spot, Anna Stevenson (Jr.) gave solid performances, and the setter for the team, Brenna Hood (So.) really improved during the season to dish the ball for her hitters.

Last fall marked a major transition in the boys volleyball program at WCHS. With the retirement of Coach Ricards, the search was on for a new leader to guide the program. In a move that was a “natural,” **Laird Musich** ('01) was named the new head coach. Bringing with him experience directing both middle school and varsity girls' programs, he started with a squad of very young players—most were sophomores. Even though the idea of maintaining the win streak may have put pressure on these younger players, they came through in fine fashion. The streak may be gone, but they can still be proud of a second place finish in Inland Coast League play. Seniors Chris Schulte at setter and Thomas Hayward at outside hitter will be missed, but a talented—and now seasoned—group of underclassmen look forward to the 2015 season. For his success, Coach Musich earned Coach of the Year honors.

Winter Sports

So tantalizingly close! The boys soccer team flirted with first place through mid-season, but injuries caused them to struggle down the stretch, and they ended up finishing fourth in league. With **Travis Cotsenmoyer** ('02) returning to lead the Royals, Garrett Perry (So. – First Team All-League) providing the scoring, and Jack DeFrank (S.) and Mitchell Maberry (Jr.), both Second Team All League, leading the defense, the Royals made the play-offs, but were edged 0-1 by Sage Hill in the first round.

The girls also benefited from an alum guiding their team this year. Photographer **Ryan Welsh** ('10) had time in his schedule, and he came on board during what was clearly a rebuilding year. Despite finishing seventh in the Ambassador League, three players earned All-League honors: Jane Noh (Sr. – First Team), Kristen Johnson (Sr.), and Emily Sublette (Jr.), both Second Team.

In the gym, the basketball teams both went deep in CIF-SS play-offs. For the girls, playing in the strong Ambassador League was probably a benefit, the fierce competition preparing them for the play-offs. With Eryn Pongs (Sr.) hitting shots from the perimeter and McKenna Prater (Jr.) pulling down board in the paint, they finished fourth in league play. Both girls earned First Team All-League honors, and the speedy little gadfly Nikki Villarosa (Sr.) made the Second Team. In play-off action, they went all the way to the Quarter Finals, and only a missed shot at the buzzer prevented them from going further.

The boys' team looked strong from the start. With returners Hezekiah Banks (Jr.) and Alex Wright (So.), they were a force to be reckoned with. But when Alec Frank (Sr.) and Thomas Hayward (Sr.) transferred from Riverside Christian,

the combination made for a league championship season. Banks took the League MVP honors, and Frank joined him on the First Team, while Hayward and Jared Christiansen (Sr.) won spots on the Second Team. In the play-offs, they rolled through the first two rounds before coming up short against a powerful Brentwood team in the quarter finals.

Spring Sports

Out on the links, the WCS golf team drove, chipped, and putted its way to a 14-4 mark, the third best record in school history. Led by returners Alec Carlson (Jr.) and Conner Hennessey (Sr.), the addition of transfer Thomas Hayward (Sr.) only deepened their roster. In the Ambassador League qualifying play, all three made it through the first day, and Carlson shot an 82 to earn the right to play in the post-season. In CIF he ended up shooting a 78 at the Victoria Club, missing the cut by three. Carlson and Hayward made First Team All-League, while Hennessey was selected to the Second Team.

Another coach that had to be replaced was swim coach Lori Woodbeck who resigned after last year's superlative season. The vacancy was filled from within the WCS faculty as Mrs. Monica Scarano took over leading the team. In what looked to be a rebuilding year, they still swam well, with the boys coming in second and the girls winning another championship; in fact the girls were able to get through league competition without a loss! For her efforts, Coach Scarano was rewarded by being recognized as Coach of the Year. In CIF competition, again held at the new aquatic center at RCC, our boys 4 x 100 freestyle relay team took a PR and ranked in the top 12, while Victoria Clemens (Jr.) came in within the top 14 in the 500 freestyle.

Woodcrest's Mountain Bike team continues to be one of the Inland

Empire teams that dominate the SoCal Cycling League. In state finals, Woodcrest riders combined for a fifth place finish in Division II. Clearly, Haley Peery (So.) stood out for the Royals with her Third Place finish in the JV girls' race at the state race.

Coach Eric Reynolds led a small group of athletes in track & field during the spring, and they showed real improvement from the previous year. The was especially visible in the girls' field events. A handful went to compete in CIF, notably distance runner Michael Conant (Jr.) whose times indicate he has a shot to challenge records set by **Jake Jeanson** ('09).

It was a young softball team that took to the field for the Royals, and they had to compete in the very tough Ambassador League. Our girls ultimately battled though that competition to earn a fourth place finish in league play. The standouts for the squad were also young, with Taylor Olsen (a freshman pitcher) and Ashley Ekbert (a sophomore catcher) taking First Team All-League honors. In addition, veteran senior Eryn Pongs earned a spot on the Second Team.

The highlight of the spring season was baseball. With only one starting senior on the team, it might have looked like the team slogan would have been, "Wait 'till next year." But that's not the way they saw it. Behind the pitching of Christian Hammar (Jr. – Ambassador League Pitcher of the Year) and Adam Zellers (Jr.), they captured yet another league

championship with an 11-1 record. Another *major* contributor to that effort came from standout freshman Branden Boissiere, who in his first year of varsity play walked away with the Player of the Year award. Based on their success in league, they moved on to CIF play where they won into the semi-finals before falling to eventual champion Hemet. To cap everything off, Coach Prater again took home the title of Coach of the Year.

The Arts

The visual art program at WCHS is flourishing under the guidance of second year art teacher Miss Megan Prosper, and two of her students were highlighted this past spring. Alexia Correa (Sr.) was recognized by Congressman Mark Takano for her painting "Reflections at the Watering Hole." Her painting will be displayed in the Capitol Building in Washington DC, and she will fly back there to be honored. This is the third time this award has been given to a WCHS student in the last few years. Then Audrey Alexander (Fr.) took Second Place in the Mixed Media Division of Present Enterprise's 53rd Annual Riverside County High School Art Show with her work entitled "Whirlpool." The visual arts will become even more varied next year as Miss Prosper will inaugurate a ceramics class.

Two significant productions took the stage in last year's drama season. In the fall, the powerful drama *Les Misérables* revealed how an act of grace can change the life of even the most jaded person. Andreas Schmidt (Sr.) played the role of Jean Valjean, the man changed by grace, while our Superintendent, Mr. Sullivan, was recruited to portray Inspector Javert, a man incapable of understanding the idea of grace.

The classic musical *Mary Poppins* recently became available for general

Clark To Lead Professions Committee
 Respected Local Psychologist To Oversee State Licensing Entities Under Department Of Consumer Affairs

The California State Assembly has hired Sacramento's Dr. Le Ondra Clark Harvey as the new Chief Consultant to the Assembly Committee on Business and Professions.

Dr. Clark Harvey assumed her role this week and will be responsible for overseeing all functions of the committee, including its staff and jurisdiction, which encompasses: consumer protection, oversight of occupational licensing entities under the Department of Consumer Affairs, and the creation and elimination of regulatory agencies, boards and commissions.

Dr. Clark Harvey previously worked for three years as a Principal Consultant to the Senate Committee on Business, Professions and Economic Development where she played an instrumental role in analyzing the majority of health related legislation that was referred to the committee.

She worked closely with several health licensing boards under the Department of Consumer Affairs to ensure that consumer protection was paramount.

Dr. Clark Harvey, a psychologist who has practiced at UCLA, USC and in community and forensic settings, also serves as a leader locally and nationally. She was appointed by the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors to both the Public Health Advisory Board and the Children's Board.

She has also served on several national psychology association boards and committees. She holds a B.A. in Psychology with minors in Quantitative Research and African American Studies from California State Polytechnic University, Pomona, and both a M.S. in Community Counseling and a Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology from the University of Wisconsin, Madison.

She brings a track record of leadership and a solid foundation of clinical research and policy expertise to her new role as Chief Consultant to the Assembly Committee on Business and Professions.








